




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Introduction

Thanks for purchasing the GPO162B Cassette Player. You are now the proud owner of a classic piece of British design – a portable radio and cassette player. It's time to dust off your old cassettes, or to buy a blank tape or two to start recording your favourite songs from the radio. It's listening enjoyment the way it always used to be.

Location of Controls



- Battery door
- 2 Dc jack

Power Source

To use with batteries (DC power source)

Place four UM-2 batteries n the battery compartment, paying careful attention to the polarity.

Note: Spent or discharged batteries must be recycled or disposed of properly in compliance with all applicable laws. For detailed information, contact your local county solid waste management authority.

Power Supply By AC Adaptor

- 1. Connect the AC/DC adaptor to the DC Jack of the unit.
- 2. Connect the AC/DC adaptor to a properly installed wall socket.

Note: Whenever the adaptor is used, the batteries are automatically disconnected.

Notes

- a. Unplug the adaptor from the mains and the unit, when the unit is not used for a longer period of time.
- Adaptor shall be installed near the equipment and shall be easily accessible.

Playback

- Push the STOP button.
- Push the EJECT button to open the cassette compartment cover. The cassette should be inserted so that the open part (where the tape is exposed) is facing upward, and holding the cassette with the wound tape on the left insert it completely into the cassette holder completely.
- Push the PLAY button.
- Adjust the volume with the volume control.
- Press the PAUSE button to stop playing temporarily. Resume normal play by pressing the PAUSE button again.
- To stop the tape, push the STOP/EJECT button once.
- Push the STOP/EJECT button again. The cover opens and the cassette can then be removed or reversed.
- When the tape comes to an end, the unit stops, and the power is turned off
- Fast forward and Rewind
 - The tape can rapidly moved forward (to the right) by pushing the FAST FORWARD button. The tape can be rapidly rewind (to the left) by pushing the REWIND button.
- Automatic stop when the tape reaches its end during playback or recording, tape recorder controls will return to their original positions and the power will be automatically turned off.

Note: Even if the PLAY button is pushed after the automatic stop system operates during playback or recording, the button will not function. To continue to use the cassette, therefore it must be rewind, or removed and turned over.

Recording

- Recording through the built in microphone.
- Push the RECORD & PLAY BUTTON together.
- Recordings can then be made through the built-in microphone.
- It is not necessary to use the microphone close to the mouth.
- The unit will be automatically turned off at the end of the tape.
- The unit can be, if desired, stopped at any time during recording.
- Erasure of recording.

Note: All previous recordings are automatically erased when a new recording is made, and only the new recording remains.



Note: Make sure that the erase prevention tab on top of the tape has not been cut off. If these tabs have been removed, the tape cannot be used for recording.

Cleaning the Unit

- The exterior casing of this unit may be cleaned with a dust cloth.
 Use caution when cleaning and wiping any plastic parts.
- · Mild soap and a damp cloth may be used to clean the front panel.
- The tape heads, capstan and pinch roller should be cleaned after every 100 hours of use. Use a cotton swab moistened with head cleaning solution or isopropyl alcohol, then carefully dry with another cotton swab.

Note: Never use metal objects on or near the tape heads. Do not allow any cleaning materials to fall into the tape assembly.

Troubleshooting

Q) The unit will not turn on

A) Ensure that the DC cable is properly connected to the unit and plugged in to a working outlet. If you are running from battery power, ensure that the batteries are fully charged and installed correctly.
